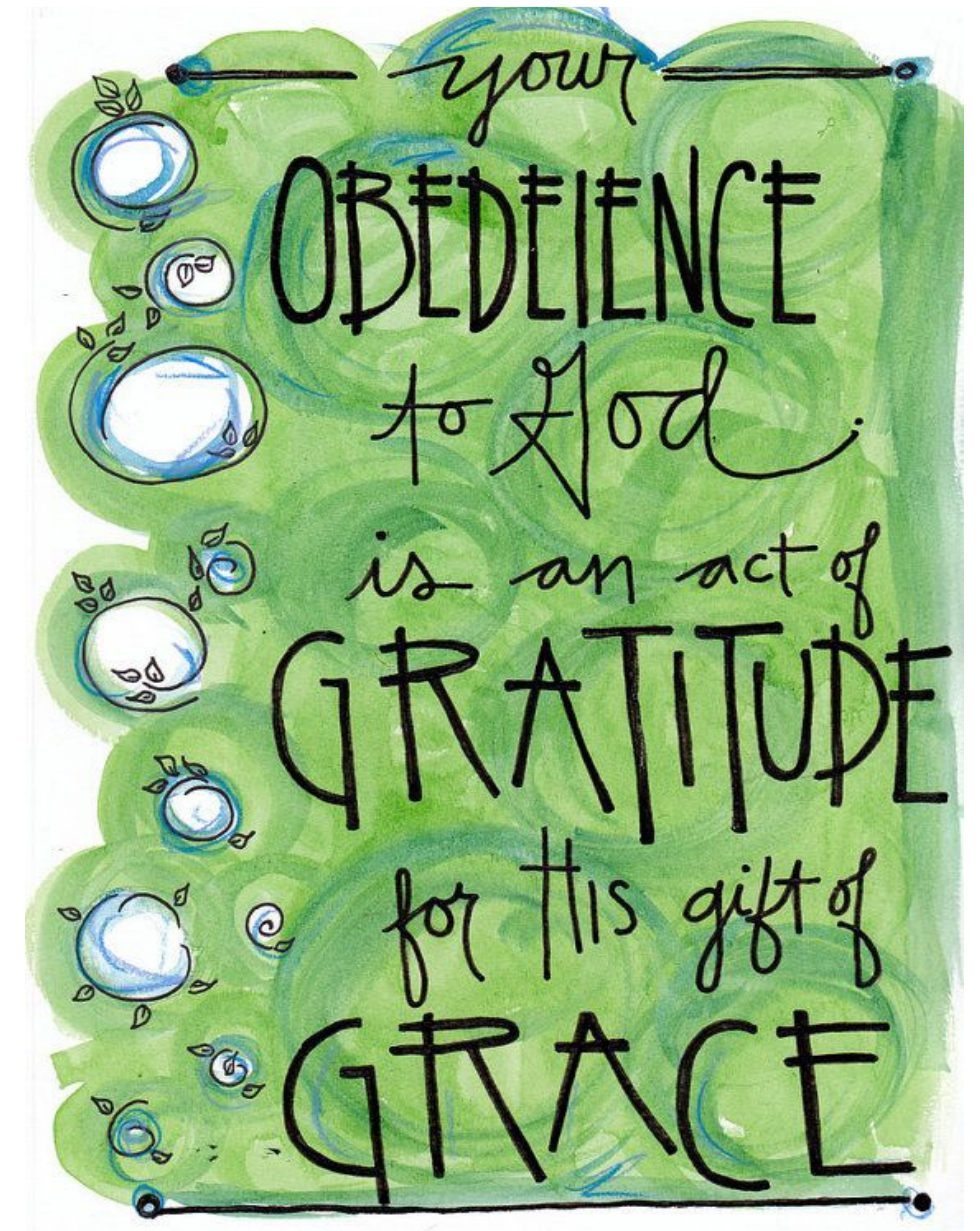
Sermon Notes

The Age of Human Government
Gen. 8:20 - 11:9

1. What could the individuals count on in this dispensation?
 - a. There would be no more additional curses on the ground (Gen. 8:21).
 - b. The seasons would not end (Gen. 8:22).
 - c. The plants and animals would serve as food (Gen. 9:2-4).
 - d. The sanctity of human life was reaffirmed (Gen. 9:5-6).
 - e. The rainbow would remind of the promise to never again destroy the earth in a flood (Gen. 9:15).
2. What were their God given responsibilities?
 - a. Be fruitful and multiply (Gen. 9:7).
 - b. Govern one another (Gen. 9:5-6).
3. What was their failure?
 - a. They were not working for God's glory (11:4).
 - b. They wanted to be independent of God (11:4).
 - c. They did not want to scatter (11:4).
4. How did God deal with their choice?
 - a. He understood that their evil would only increase (8:21; 11:6).
 - b. He confused their languages (11:7-9).

Conclusion:

1. Pray for your leaders (1 Tim. 2:1-2).
2. Be the best citizen you can be (Acts 5:29; Rom. 13:1-3).
3. Understand that there is punishment for disobedience (1 Pet. 4:15; Rom. 13:4).
4. Obey Christ no matter what (1 Pet. 4:14, 16).
